

Whereof witnesseth that Chauk alias Chaque the Sachem of Pocomack for good & valluable Considerations him thereunto moving, hath given, granted, Bargained & sold, & by these presents doth for himself & his Brother Wapahoale fully, clearly & absolutely give, grant, Bargaine & sell unto Capt John Lynch of Springfield for his self & behalfe of Major Eleazar Lupton & Kingue Danyffrith their English of Dedham, their Associate, & Successor, & to them, & their heirs for ever, Certaine yds. of Land at Pocomack on the souther side or syd side or North side of Pocomack River, that is to say beginning at the aforesaid river, and Pocomack River, & so alittle way up Pocomack River, & then leading Pocomack River, runs off to the Sunpich westward: All of land fed the Hill Sunpich on the westward, downe the River Pocomack layward below Nayyocoffick to Pocheeves, neare the mouth of Pocomack River; each yds. of Land are called Nayyocoffick, Tomhollisick, Mass vom Cossick, Ussowack, Wissawaway & so to Sunpich hill, or by what ever other names the Land is or maybe called: All is aforesaid tract of land, being called by several names as aforesaid Nayyocoffick, Tomhollisick, Mass vom Cossick, Ussowack, Wissawaway & Sunpich, or by what ever other name it maybe called, together with the trees, waters, meadows, wood, Banks, vallans, Stones, pebbles, Comodities & advantages theraff belonging or in anywise appertaining, the aforesaid Major Eleazar Lupton & English & their associates, & successors, & their heires are to have, hold & enjoy the same for ever, only the to Chauk alias Chaque doth reserve liberty of fishing for Indians in the Rivers, or water, & free liberty to hunt deer or other wild creatures, & to gather walnuts, cheynuts & other edibles on the Commons: And the said Chaque doth hereby Covenant & Promise to the aforesaid Major Eleazar Lupton & Daniffrith, their associates & their heires to give, & let to the said Major Eleazar Lupton & Daniffrith, their associates & their heires to signes, & acknowledge of the said all manner of claimes of any person or persons, Indians claiming any right, title or interest in any of the lands herein, & in any part of the aforesaid tract, & will defend the same from any molestation or disturbance by Indians otherwith than as before expressed, for no tyme thereafter shall the said Chaque have hereunto set his hand this 24th feb 1665
